Keeping Our Young People Safe

George Tomlinson School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expects all staff (including supply staff) volunteers and visitors to share this commitment.

No-one wants to hear about children being abused, neglected or unsafe and that sometimes makes it difficult to respond so...

Remember these three important messages;

- 1. All children have a right to be safe no matter who they are or what their circumstances.
- 2. Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- 3. We all need to listen to children even though we may not always be comfortable with what we hear.

Safeguarding is Everyone's Responsibility

Young people can be abused physically, sexually, emotionally or through neglect.

The concerns you have may make up part of a bigger picture which could help to prevent serious harm to a young person. Giving families help at an early stage can prevent abuse and neglect.
